# SERVICE PREMIUM

At Pirbright we are incredibly proud of our links with the military and have children from a range of different service backgrounds across the local area. We work hard to ensure transition, both in and out of school, is as efficient as possible for parents whilst welcoming the children into our community with open arms. Our objective is always to ensure that children feel settled, safe and happy as soon as possible so they can begin their learning journey with us and be fully integrated in our school community and all it has to offer.

The purpose of the school's Service Pupil Premium (SSP) is to support children who come from military families during challenging times and, as a school, we receive a sum of money for each of our children who have serving parents. The aim is to reduce the potential impact of being in a service family during difficult times, be that with mobility or deployment. The school must provide planned provision over time and the school have full responsibility for how we spend our SPP. It is not a fund which can be directly accessed by parents of eligible children.

## Service Premium Strategy Statement

This statement details our school's use of pupil premium (and recovery premium for the 2021 to 2022 academic year) funding to help improve the attainment of our disadvantaged pupils. # PROMOTING EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND LIFE SKILLS (PEDALS)

At Pirbright Village Primary School it is understood that for pupils to be successful academically, they need to be happy and feel safe in their environment. At times in a child's life, there will be moments when they feel insecure, worried or concerned. There will also be times when children go through changes in circumstance, which may result in home life straying from what they know as the norm. During these times, our PEDALS Team is here to help.

Erin Hinzman, PVPS's Home/School Partner, and her colleague, Mrs Heather, are here to help pupils and their families during periods of anxiety, uncertainty and/or upheaval by offering Talk Time, along with focused support, to explore feelings and identify useful coping strategies. Erin is also available to provide parenting support by liaising with parents and exploring effective ways of managing children's behaviour.




# PIRBRIGHT CLUB CLASS

We are a school that provides an amazing Pirbright experience to our extended services which expanded in September 2018 to include wrap-around care. Pirbright Club Class is run by Mrs Allen and employs members of staff who are experts in their field. Their skill and ability in caring and nurturing Pirbright Village Primary School pupils is widely acknowledged amongst the school community. Making great use of the school's wonderful facilities with a vast array of top quality resources, will allow children to have fun, to be inspired and to unwind after a busy day in the classroom. Pirbright Club Class is run by the school, following the school's ethos, ensuring that pupils never want to go home.

- ✓ Club Class is open to all members of the school.
- ✓ Breakfast Club runs from 7:45am – 8:45am.
- ✓ Pupils will access cereals and toast before having the chance to take part in a myriad of activities such as yoga, table tennis, circuits and much, much more.
- ✓ After School Club runs from 3:15pm – 6:00pm.
- ✓ Theme-based activities include cookery, crafts, board games, reading, imaginary play, construction, music, sport and much more.
- ✓ Children are offered many opportunities to explore and develop new interests and skills, both inside and outside of the school environment, and can choose the activities that appeal to them most.
- ✓ If you would like your child to have a more substantial meal, then you can select a home-cooked meal provided by the school's caterer Cleverchefs.
