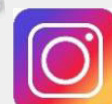

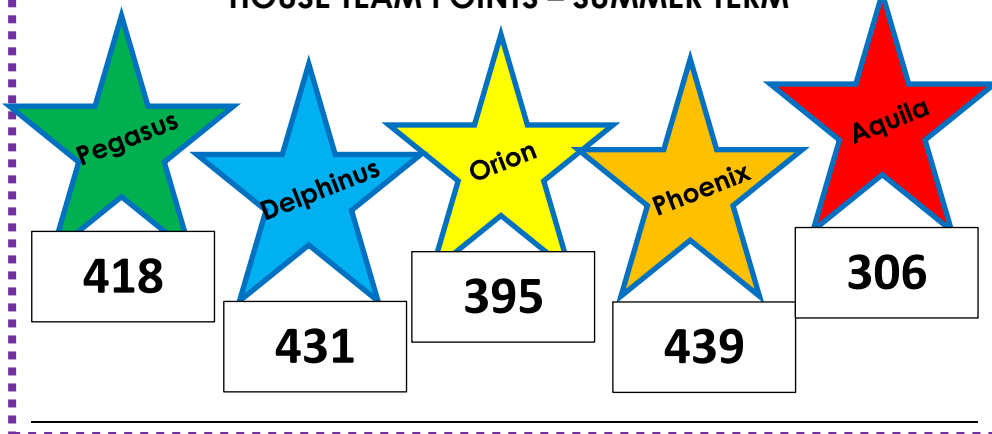

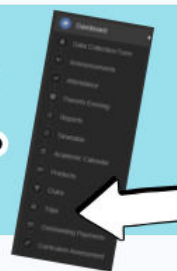

These evenings are a valuable opportunity to meet with your child's class teacher(s), talk about their progress and celebrate their achievements, as well as discuss any next steps for their learning. Appointments can be booked in advance using the **MCAS App**. **Booking will go live on Monday 21st September at 10:00am and will close at 6:00pm on Friday 25th September.** If you have any difficulties accessing MCAS, booking an appointment, or miss the booking window, please contact the school office or speak to your child's class teacher, who will be happy to help.



Parents' Evenings & Pirbucks

Pirbucks is much like Starbucks only run by children and better for the world! Year 6 host and ensure tea & coffee alongside cakes and sweet treats are on hand for parents (and children if parents choose to share). All money goes towards their residential at the end of the year. Pirbucks is available for all but it sometimes misses out on KS1 and Reception parents if they don't quite make it over to the hall. The Year 6 children will have baked and bought goodies to go with hot drinks so head on over to celebrate your child's achievements, donate to the good people of Year 6 and generally have a merry old time! Please note, you may have bagged yourself an earlier appointment with a class teacher but this does not mean Pirbucks will be open – they have very strict opening hours to match the official Parents' Evening timings so if they are not open then apologies. **All purchases are a donation**, so if you don't bring change, the children will happily relieve you of notes – please plan ahead as they are hard to resist!

All children need to be supervised and whilst Pirbucks is happening in the hall; it is not for childcare, so please make arrangements to ensure someone is watching your children whilst you are in with class teachers. Reception and KS1 parents head to the classrooms and KS2 parents head to the school hall to be collected by the class teachers; please don't use the outer doors as the teachers will be in meetings and you don't want to interrupt. There will be opportunities to see any learning that has happened in the first few weeks.

If your child "achieves" or takes part in something special outside of school (local football team, village show, scouts award, sporting event and the like) then please send a photo and a short description to Mrs Dow either at her email address or at celebrate@pirbright.surrey.sch.uk and she will pop it up on the display board in the hall for all to admire.

Photo Sharing – Moving Forward

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our recent photo-sharing survey. We received 43 responses, and your feedback has helped us think carefully about how we can continue sharing the wonderful experiences our children have at school while keeping their privacy at the heart of what we do.

- ✓ **86%** said seeing photographs of their child's experiences at school is quite or very important to them.
- ✓ **81%** said photographs help them feel connected to their child's school life.
- ✓ Families particularly value seeing trips, assemblies, sporting events and special experiences that they cannot always attend.
- ✓ **76%** of parents look at the photos within a couple of weeks of them being posted.
- ✓ **65%** said they would feel more comfortable with a password-protected space for photographs, even recognising that passwords can potentially be shared.
- ✓ **Several parents** specifically highlighted that they are comfortable with photographs being shared on Instagram when children's faces are not identifiable.

What happens next?

We are now looking at how we can keep the things families value about our current approach while strengthening privacy and security. We have also had support from The Learning Partners Safeguarding Team to ensure we are keeping a sensible balance between sharing what is important to parents and trying to mitigate risks.

All the photo albums for the term will have the same password. 65% of our parents said this would make them feel better, even with the risk of password sharing and our Trust thought this was an appropriate level of security to minimise risk for those who choose to have their children in photos.
Website	Photos in other areas of the website	We will start to reduce these down over the year	There are areas of the website such as School Council and House Captains where we used to put photos of the children. We will still have these in the hall, but not put them on the website as they are open to anyone.
Website	The "advertising" ones	We will check for permission over the next few weeks for them to remain. We will check in the future before posting new ones.	There are a few pictures on the scrolling banner at the top of the website of children which bring the website to life. They are open to anyone so we will double check parents are still happy with this and check in the future for news ones. If you know your child is on there and want to let Mrs Dow know now (she is in charge of the website and the photos!) this would save her a job in emailing you 😊... cdow@pirbright.surrey.sch.uk

You can collect it at the end of the school day from the school office. Please leave through the front door (right by the office).

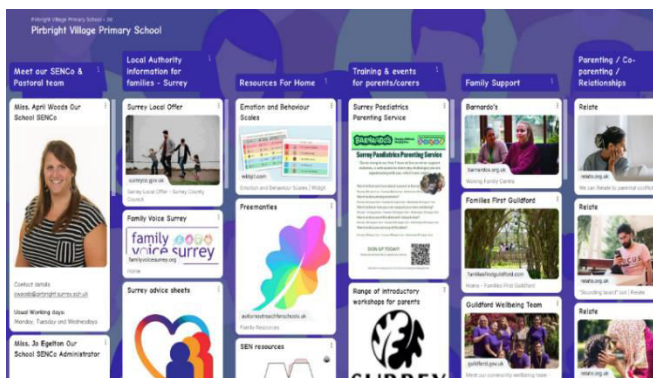

The Nurturing Programme is a 10-week group course to help parents and carers deal with the challenges of family life and create a calmer, happier environment.
