



Dear Parents & Carers,

It is with great sadness that I announce we have reached the end of our lovely class assemblies this morning; but what a class assembly it was! A big well done and thank you to 2BT for such a fun and educational experience.

Next week we will be welcoming you all to Sports Day and our Family Lunch on Friday. The forecast is hot for the day, as it is for much of next week, so plenty of sun cream, caps and water bottles in please! All the other details, including the running order, are further down the newsletter.

On Tuesday and Wednesday, we are looking forward to welcoming the children and parents who will be joining Reception in September. This is an opportunity for the children to stay and play with their parents - an excellent way to begin to settle into their new school. We would like to extend a very warm welcome to all of our New Entrants!

Although wearing football kits on Mufti Days was one of the easier decisions I've had to make since becoming a head teacher, I'm afraid that I will be sticking with the "hair tied up" rule regardless of the clothes being worn. If your child has hair longer than shoulder length, please can they have it tied back to allow them to be able to see well and to help prevent any hair snagging accidents - thank you.

This afternoon we will be practising our latest lockdown drill. This is the opposite of a fire drill where all children, staff and visitors are kept inside the buildings for approximately 5 minutes. This is to ensure that everyone knows what to do should there be an external threat. In order to keep the children from worrying about things that 4-11 year olds should not worry about, staff tell the children that such a threat could be a bull on the field (we've had 3 occasions of that to date!) or extremely adverse weather. We do not give the children any other possible scenarios and ask that you please do not discuss other, more sinister potential incidents. Yesterday we had a preview of the alarm sound so the children know what to expect this afternoon.

Don't forget your sun cream and water bottles this weekend - it's looking like it could be a lovely one!

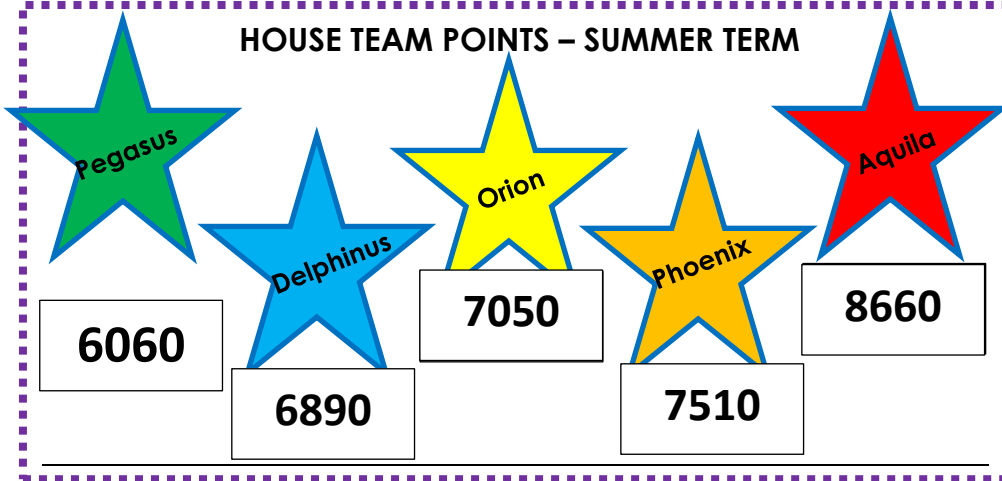

In an effort to continue to improve our extra curricular provision we are excited to announce a fantastic opportunity for September 2025.

Forest School sessions offer a fantastic opportunity for children to forge a deeper connection with nature while honing skills that foster independence and creativity.

Our after school club programme consists of six sessions, accommodating groups of 15 children from KS2. Sessions typically span consecutive weeks, from 3:15pm - 4:45pm.

The Level 3 qualified Forest School leader will work closely with school staff to tailor sessions to accommodate all KS2 ages, abilities, and interests, to ensure all needs are met.

As the weeks progress and children grow more comfortable in the Forest School environment, they are encouraged to take the lead in their play. Leaders are adept at recognising and nurturing individual learning styles, allowing children to learn at their own pace.

The cost for a 6 week course will be £120 per child.

## Sports Day & Family Lunch

Regarding Sports Day, Key Stage 2 events will kick off at 9:30am (entry via the KS2 gate) and should be finished by 11:30am.
