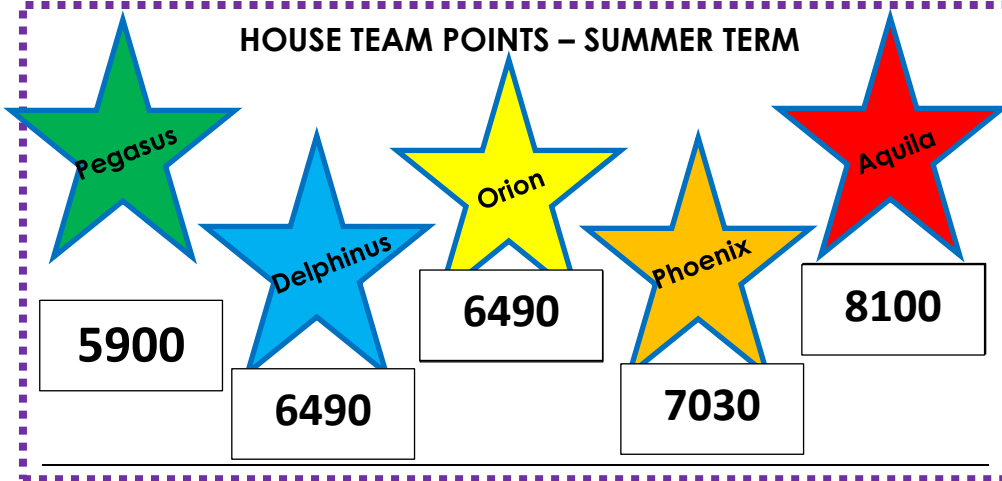

79% of 3-17-year-olds now have a social media profile, with many including public photos. With children navigating digital spaces from ever-younger ages, staying informed is crucial. This handy guide provides an update on the latest trends, activities and behaviours of children and young people online, identifying risks so that we understand where to focus preventive measures and support.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about OFCOM MEDIA REPORT 2025

Every year, Ofcom releases its Children and Parents: Media Use and Attitudes Report, offering fresh insights into how young people are using digital platforms. The 2025 edition highlights key safeguarding concerns as children's engagement with social media, gaming, and live streaming continues to grow. This guide pulls out the top statistics from the report, focussing on the main areas of concern for parents and educators.

- ONLINE LIVES:** 37% of children are engaging with social media and online content at increasing rates. 79% now have access to social media profiles, however only a third (33%) use it independently of parents. 66% have a social media profile, with 16% including public photos.
- ONLINE GAMING:** Gaming remains popular but raises concerns. 74% of children say they play with someone they know, while 22% report playing with strangers.
- PARENTAL CONCERNS:** Parents are increasingly worried about online risks. 70% fear their child may see inappropriate or sexual content. 68% fear exposure to contact from persons (call/text). 72% worry about their child being gossiped about or having information taken. 69% are concerned about online bullying.
- SCREEN TIME:** Screen time is still a major challenge for parents. 70% of parents of 10-14 year olds say it is difficult to manage screen time. 33% of 8-10 year olds have screen time that is too high. At 29% vs 24%, boys were more likely than girls to disagree that their screen time is too high.
- HARMFUL CONTENT & INTERACTIONS:** 18% of children continue to have negative feelings about social media and messaging apps. Nearly 60% of boys (58%) believe that people are mean or unkind to each other online all or most of the time. Girls aged 8-17 are more likely than boys to say they have experienced someone being nasty or hurtful to them online (51%). One third of teenagers agree that it's important that people can say what they want online, even if it offends someone.
- ONLINE SAFETY IN SCHOOLS:** 92% of children agreed to look for and report harmful content. The top three topics covered are: 63% Harm to reputation, 62% Harassment, 62% Sexual content.

Regarding Sports Day, Key Stage 2 events will kick off at 9:30am (entry via the KS2 gate) and should be finished by 11:30am. Family Lunch will then begin and continue until around 1:15pm with the KS1 and Reception events beginning at 1:30pm. We aim to finish at around 3pm after a short presentation. If you are onsite for Sports Day then you will naturally roll into Family Lunch (feel free to bring a picnic if you would prefer), but if you are just coming for Family Lunch, and perhaps staying for Sports Day in the afternoon, entry is via the KS1 gate where you will be able to collect your children and start your lunch. You're welcome any time after 11:30am but might want to keep an eye on the lunch queue and play for a little while first.

As always, please ensure your child has their cap in school, a water bottle and suntan lotion applied. All children will need their coloured team t-shirts on the day with their blue PE shorts and trainers (not plimsolls). If the weather deteriorates over the week, we will decide at 8am on the morning of the event. If it is to be cancelled, it will be put on the school's website and Instagram feed. Fingers crossed we have great weather as we have no idea when we can fit in a Plan B!

Late Registrations

We have a few Late Registrations coming up over the next few weeks/months but just wanted to reassure parents, these are late (and totally optional) for children. The staff will all be at school as normal and gates will be open from 0810 with Breakfast Club available to book beforehand if needed. There are two Late Registrations associated with the residential visits as neither finish on a Friday like usual. Forest School at Pirbright

In collaboration with 'Kind of Wild, nature connection and play'

In an effort to continue to improve our extra curricular provision we are excited to announce a fantastic opportunity for September 2025.

Forest School sessions offer a fantastic opportunity for children to forge a deeper connection with nature while honing skills that foster independence and creativity.

Our after school club programme consists of six sessions, accommodating groups of 15 children from KS2. Sessions typically span consecutive weeks, from 3:15pm - 4:45pm.

The Level 3 qualified Forest School leader will work closely with school staff to tailor sessions to accommodate all KS2 ages, abilities, and interests, to ensure all needs are met.

As the weeks progress and children grow more comfortable in the Forest School environment, they are encouraged to take the lead in their play. Leaders are adept at recognising and nurturing individual learning styles, allowing children to learn at their own pace.

The cost for a 6 week course will be £120 per child.

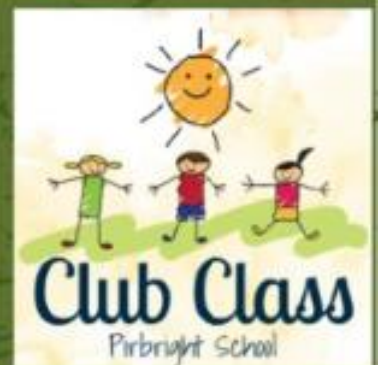

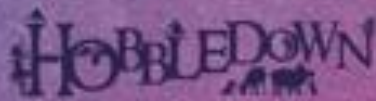
