Finally, even the hardest of us must have turned the heating on by now...! The cold snap however did not deter Year 3 on Wednesday, and they had a wonderful time at Butser Farm. They learnt how to wattle, weaving sticks together to create simple fencing; make cordage, twisting plant fibres together and building beds from basic materials and testing them for comfort.

Thursday saw Year 2 also brave the elements, dressed in Brazilian carnival wear and spending the day learning songs, dances and different traditions of the largest South American country. The children made their own salsa and masks to enjoy in their own Brazilian style carnival at the end of the day - such fun!

Year 5 also had a themed day yesterday and dressed in their finest wizardry attire to experiment with reversible and irreversible reactions (or potions!), including suspensions and solutions! The children explored the irreversible reaction of acetic acid and sodium hydrogen carbonate (vinegar and bicarbonate of soda to you and I) as well as finding ways to reclaim the salt from a solution through evaporation, and how filtering can separate parts of a suspension - very impressive, Year 5!

With only 2 full weeks to go before Shows' Week, the hall and classrooms are filling with songs, line-learning and dance moves all in preparation. Hopefully you've managed to secure your tickets in yesterday's sale! Just one more Mufti Day next Friday, 29th November ready for the FOPs' Christmas Fair that afternoon.

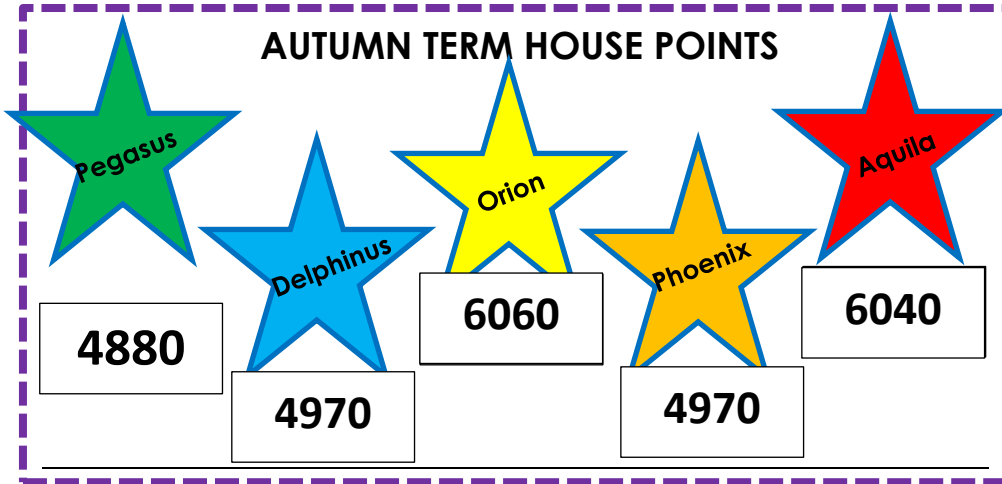

The first wave of Christmas production tickets has been very successful with 630 tickets allocated on Thursday by the ticketing fairies. The Box Office has now reopened for Phase 2 of ticketing where you are welcome to select some more tickets. Based on the current numbers, you are welcome to select "the same again" so please see details on each of the forms which you can access below.

**Reception parents do not need to apply for tickets online.**

In short, KS1 can have two more per afternoon; KS2 is two for one evening (or split between two evenings) and an additional four for Tuesday afternoon. Please use the links below. Please note, in KS2 the Google form will allow you to order more than two tickets because it is not as intelligent as we would like; you will only be allocated **two tickets** for an evening performance again next week, so choose wisely! The web-links are below; alternatively, there is a whole area for Christmas Play Tickets on the school website so head over and have a look.

Pre-school siblings will need their own seat – you are of course welcome to have them on your lap but they still need their own ticket and please think carefully about their ability to sit and listen for the whole show – it is not a panto! There is little room in the hall, so if you have a pushchair you will be asked to leave it outside – babies can be in arms and don't need a ticket!

Tickets are available online from now until **Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> November at 8am** when the box office will close and all of the ticket requests will be allocated on that day. On Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November, the box office will reopen for Phase 3 of ticketing if there are any left; look out in next week's newsletter for further details – this depends on the Phase 2 allocations. ## IN CASE YOU MISSED IT LAST WEEK...

### A Guide to the Christmas Productions for New Parents (& Old Parents Who Need a Reminder...)

At this time of year across the school, staff are busy preparing pupils for our Christmas shows, if you have not been to one at Pirbright before, you are in for a treat!

**Reception:** Reception will perform their own nativity show in a separate performance. All parents are welcome to four seats in the hall and do not need to book online. It's on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December at 10am. Children will be busy singing and learning their lines; teachers might be smiling nicely at you for costumes...

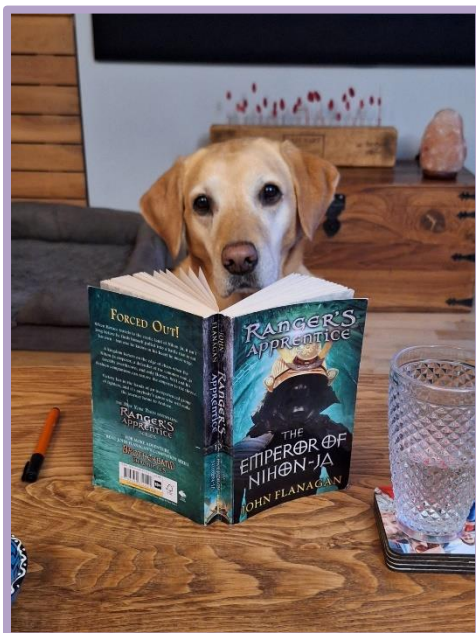
**Key Stage 1:** Year 1 and 2 take to the stage for their performance. Class teachers will be providing pupils with scripts and lines to be learnt, where appropriate, and you may find teachers trying to catch you on the door to discuss any costume options! Two performances take place in the afternoon of Plays Week. They usually start at 1.30 with the shows expected to be finished before the end of the school day, giving just enough time for pupils to get changed and be ready for collection at the usual time. The shows are on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December. Pre-school aged children can come on Wednesday (but are expected to be able to sit quietly – it is not a panto!) but Thursday is adults and older children only! We're very strict on this so please choose your performance wisely.

**Key Stage 2 Production:** This is run by Mr. Wright. Main parts are taken by the Year 6 pupils, with every year group having a song and dance number as part of the show. It's great to do something that involves everyone. As well as this, there are opportunities to join Miss Durdle's dance troupe for Year 6 and Mrs Davies is at the helm of the singing which add a little sparkle to proceedings. Year groups will come home with song words to learn; perhaps some other lines for their scenes as well as requests to help them with costumes. If you need any help then speak to the class teacher who can guide you in the right direction.

We have one performance during school time (Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> – 1:30pm start) but the other performances are in the evening of the Plays Week (Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December). Pre-school aged children can come on Tuesday (but are expected to be able to sit quietly – it is not a panto!); Wednesday & Thursday is adults and older children only! **Pupils need to be back at school for 6:30pm. It is really important for pupils to be back at school and to be part of the production, as this is a big part of belonging to the Pirbright family. If there is an exceptional reason for a child not to be back for a performance (such as illness) then please let the class teacher know as soon as possible.** On returning to school, children should have had their dinner at home. If you need to send them in with a healthy snack, please do so but it needs to follow normal school rules and not be chocolate or contain nuts.

*We will give you an indication of end timings as soon as we know, usually around 8:30pm. Children can be collected from classroom doors whether you have seen the show or are just doing the pick-up. The front doors will only be for exiting after the show, so please don't use them to enter at the end of the evening to collect children. We will confirm timings when we have actually had a practise on the stage!*

### Winter Weather

Whilst we might be feeling the chill today, it looks like we have gotten off lightly by not having snow or the worry about school closures this week. It could happen to us though! We will always try and communicate as effectively and early as possible when it comes to the weather and balance the safety of the children with the ability to open school. We're a hardy bunch at Pirbright, but we don't all live locally to the school so please remember that we will be assessing which members of staff can get to school in case of snow. If Surrey Police make the decision that it is "emergency travel only", this will almost certainly mean we won't be open and we are often waiting for a decision from them. We will let you know of decisions through texts and emails (SCOPAY) and an update to Instagram as soon as we know anything. There could also be times when we operate a stagger to morning drop-offs and early collections in order to get everyone in or out of school safely which we will let you know about. If we have to close for a Snow Day, the first day will almost certainly be a day at home playing in the snow. If we are closed for more than one day then we will communicate some home learning options for you.
