Once again, I was completely blown away by this Friday's class assembly. The children spoke with such confidence and clarity, and it was clear how much effort they had put into learning their lines. Assemblies like these are always a joy and a real celebration of the children's hard work and teamwork – well done to everyone in 2CD!

A shout out also goes to our second Year 6 Bikeability group, who completed their week of training today. The children showed great determination and focus, and they should be very proud of themselves for developing such important life skills. One of the trainers commented on how thoughtful and thorough their questions were when tackling the theory element of cycling safely.

Next week is Parents' Evening which provides a valuable opportunity for you to meet with your child's teacher, celebrate their successes and discuss next steps in their learning. These conversations help strengthen the partnership between home and school and ensure that we are working together to support every child to achieve their best. We really appreciate you taking the time to attend.

I would also like to take a moment to thank our wonderful parent volunteers; we are incredibly lucky to have such generous support. A particular shout-out must go to those who have been supporting Forest School – even in the rain and the mud! Your enthusiasm and commitment make a real difference to the children's experiences.

Last week, I was approached by a local resident who does not have children at Pirbright School but who received a card from the school, designed by a pupil here. This was a part of the Year 4 Christmas Card Factory we run every year where children design and make cards which are distributed but The Pirbright Trust to local residents. So touched by this, they have very kindly donated an amazing £1,250 to us. They asked that the money be spent on something linked to citizenship which has allowed us to invest in a new PSHE scheme for the school. We are extremely grateful to our benefactor, who has asked to remain anonymous, for this thoughtful and generous gift.

We spent a busy INSET Day on Wednesday either at subject network meetings across The Trust (ie art, science etc) and then in the afternoon were treated to some pedagogical reflection time with our new School Improvement Partners which certainly got the cylinders firing! We knew what the children feel like at the end of the day with a serious case of cognitive overload!

Finally, Reception Key Stage's 1 lost property has been cleaned, dried and returned to its owners where possible. Unfortunately, all unnamed items could not be reunited with their children... because they are unnamed! A gentle reminder to name all items of school clothing so they can find their way home in the future.

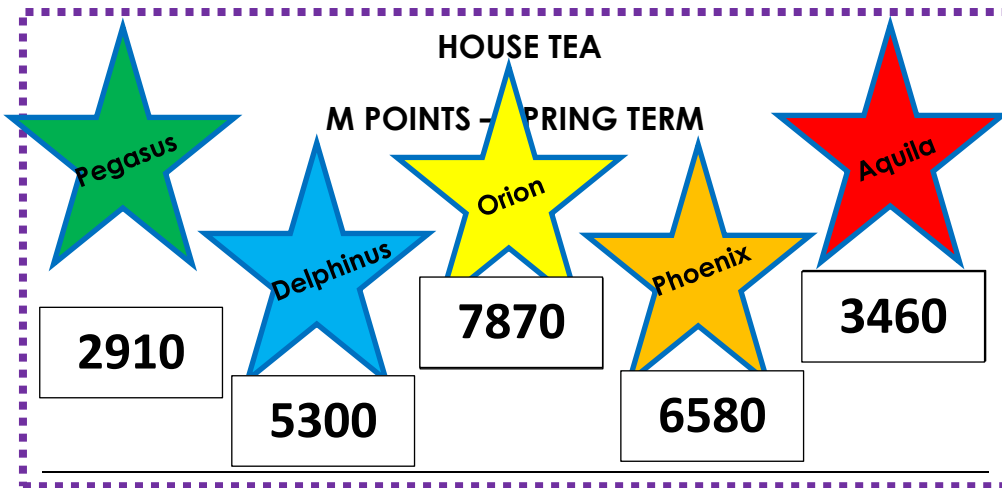

Concept 4 - My Signals, My Zones



WHAT ARE WE LEARNING?

In this concept we learned about **body signals** - the sensations inside our body that help us figure out how we feel. Body signals are clues that help us to understand our emotions and notice if we are changing Zones. Each of us is unique. We do not all experience our Zones, emotions, or body signals the same way.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Noticing our body signals helps us understand and identify our feelings and alert us to when we change Zones. This self-awareness helps us with is foundational to self-regulation. When we understand how we feel, it is easier for us to figure out how to regulate those feelings/Zones.

ASK AND SHARE

These are questions you can discuss with your learner. Be sure to share your own thoughts and experiences.

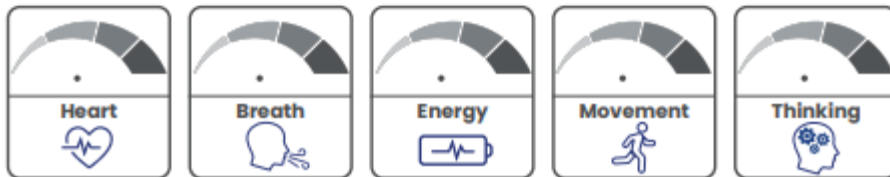
- What is a feeling you often have when you're in the Blue Zone? What body signals do you notice? (Repeat for each of the different Zones, Red, Yellow, and Green.)

Body signals I notice are:



Energy

- Depending on your Zone, your body may sometimes feel like a battery that's overflowing with power
- Other times it may feel like your battery is low or you've lost all your charge, like when you're sick or exhausted.

BODY SIGNALS WE EXPLORED

Heart

- Our heart may beat fast or slow
- It can ache with sadness or swell with pride
- Sometimes our heart is thumping with excitement or pounding with fear
- Other times, you might not notice it at all

Breath (lungs)

- Our breathing also changes depending on our feelings and Zone
- You may be yawning or sighing with big slow breath or gasping with surprise.

Thinking

- Our brain sends signals that can help us understand how we feel
- Have you noticed times when your thinking seems clear and really focused?
- Other times your thoughts might feel like they are racing quickly
- Sometimes our thinking is foggy and sluggish, and it may take us extra time to make a choice or remember something

Movement

- Sometimes our bodies feel still and quiet, like when we're relaxed, reading a book or watching a movie
- At other times, our bodies are full of motion, such as when we're bouncing with excitement or fidgety with nerves
- We also might have big and powerful movements that can be harder to control, such as jumping, running or bumping into things

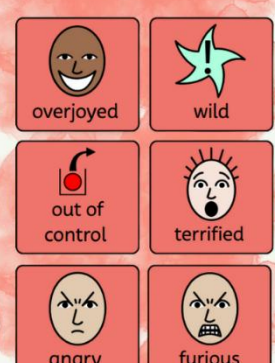

I just heard that over £1m worth of Lego was stolen from Hamley’s last night....

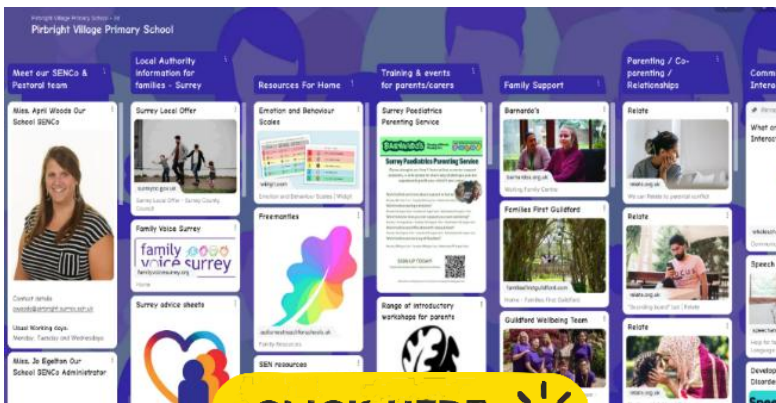
