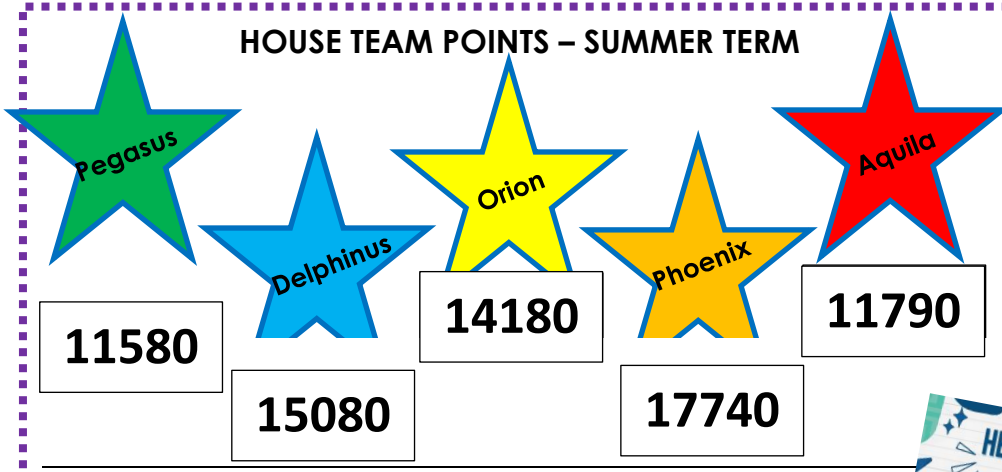

Move-Up Sessions - Next Week...

Next week we begin our transition for 2026/2027 with Move-Up Sessions. This is where the children will be introduced to their new class teacher(s). A successful transition is really important for all of the children and by doing it early we can ensure that the children have a good amount of time to prepare themselves for the inevitable change. All of the children will have the opportunity to meet their new class teacher on Monday morning for an hour and again on Thursday afternoon for an hour. The children will go on Monday with their usual LSA so there will be a familiar face for them and then the new LSAs will be there on Thursday so they will get to meet the whole team. Children in Years R, 2 and 4 will be sent up in their new classes as they have been mixed. We know that change is inevitable and this can bring some anxiety for some children. It is perfectly normal for children (and adults!) to feel wobbly at this time of year and we totally acknowledge these feelings and hear them. Reminding children that they have done it before, will do it again and have probably had even bigger changes that they have managed in life is a good place to start! We appreciate your support with this.

Changes to Free School Meals (from September 2026)

We would like to inform you about important national changes to Free School Meals (FSM) that will take effect from September 2026. These changes may affect your child's eligibility, either now or in the future. **What is changing?** From September 2026 all children in households receiving Universal Credit will be eligible for free school meals, regardless of income. This means many more families will be able to access free school meals.

End of current protections

At present, once a child qualifies for free school meals, they usually keep that entitlement even if family circumstances change; this is called Transitional Protection. This protection will continue until the end of the 2025/26 school year. From September 2026, eligibility will be based on your current circumstances. This means some children may gain or lose eligibility depending on changes to household income or benefits.

Important: You still need to apply!

Even if you receive Universal Credit, free school meals are not automatically given. You must still apply through school. If you think your child may be eligible, we strongly encourage you to apply.

Why apply?

Registering for free school meals can:-

- Provide free, nutritious lunches for your child.
- Help the school access additional funding to support pupils.
- Ensure you receive any related support you may be entitled to.

What should you do now?

- If your child already receives free school meals you do not need to take action at this stage. We will contact you if anything changes.
- If you think you may be eligible, please contact the school as soon as possible.
- If your circumstances change, please notify the school at your earliest convenience.

These changes are designed to help more families access free school meals, when they need them. We encourage all parents who may be eligible to apply and ensure they receive the support available.

Sports Day & Family Lunch

We are very much looking forward to welcoming everyone in for Sports Day & Family Lunch on **Friday 19th June**. The menu is → and already loaded onto IPAY for you to order for your children. Ordering for adults, pre-school and post-primary siblings and extended family is open on MCAS so you can start ordering now! **All orders must be done by Monday 15th June**. Please see the guide attached for how to order on MCAS for adults.

Following the adaptations made to last year's itinerary due to the hot weather, feedback from parents was very positive. We have decided to keep this adapted timetable (which will become the new plan moving forward) and enjoy a slightly quieter crowd and less waiting time for children and adults in KS2 so feel free to just come along for your timeslot if this is better for you.

Key Stage 2 events will kick off at 9:30am (entry via the KS2 gate) and should be finished by 11:30am. Family Lunch will then begin and continue until around 1:15pm with the KS1 and Reception events beginning at 1:30pm. We aim to finish at around 3pm. If you are onsite for Sports Day then you will naturally roll into Family Lunch (feel free to bring a picnic if you would prefer), but if you are just coming for Family Lunch, and perhaps staying for Sports Day in the afternoon, **entry is via the KS1 gate** where you will be able to collect your children and start your lunch. You're welcome any time after 11:30am but might want to keep an eye on the lunch queue and play for a little while first. We aim to be all done and dusted by 3pm.

As always, please ensure your child has their cap in school, a water bottle and suntan lotion applied. All children will need their coloured team t-shirts on the day with their blue PE shorts and trainers (not plimsolls).
